Best for: Elementary age

Supplies: Markers, crayons or colored pencils

Drawing or sketch paper, no smaller than 8.5" x 11"

Certificate definitions (from www.DynaMindsPublishing.com)

Vocabulary words (from glossary in *Stock Market Pie: Grandma Helps*

Emily Make a Million book)

Discussion: Talk about what a stock certificate is (proof of ownership) and how

you get one. Show samples. Discuss terms used (such as shares, stock symbol, CUSIP number) as well as why companies want to create a

unique certificate.

Discuss why stock certificates make trading more difficult today, since

most investors hold their stocks "in street name."

Directions: Have each student design a stock certificate for either a real company

or a fictional one. Let students describe why they chose to use certain

symbols.
